**ECONOMIC SECTORS IN ESSENTIAL SERVICES ALLOWED TO OPERATE DURING THE MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER PERIOD IN PULAU PINANG, SELANGOR, WILAYAH PERSEKUTUAN (KUALA LUMPUR, PUTRAJAYA, LABUAN), MELAKA, JOHOR AND SABAH**

Following the Prime Minister's [announcement](#) on 11 January 2021 on the Movement Control Order ("MCO") for the period from 13 January 2021 to 26 January 2021 (reported in our [e-CTIM GEN 1/2021](#) dated 12 January 2021), the Senior Minister of International Trade and Industry has issued a [Media Release dated 12 January 2021](#) which provides a list of economic sectors in essential services that are allowed to operate during the MCO period subject to complying with MCO and standard operating procedure ("SOP") requirements. The list of economic sectors in essential services include professional services (including accountants / lawyers / auditors / engineers / architects) as set-out in item 27 of Lampiran 1 of the [Media Release](#).
