# CUSTOMS (PROVISIONAL ANTI – DUMPING DUTIES) ORDER 2015 – P.U.(A) 218-2015

This Order imposes provisional anti-dumping duties (refer to the table below) on imports of Prepainted / Painted / Colour Coated Steel Coils from China and Viet Nam effective from 26 September 2015 to 23 January 2016.

The provisional duties levied under this Order shall be guaranteed by a security which amount is equal to the amount of duties levied.

#### **Background:**

On 30 March 2015, the Government received a petition from a domestic producer for imposition of anti-dumping duty on imports of Pre-painted / Painted / Colour Coated Steel Coils originating in or exports from, the People's Republic of China, and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam on the grounds that such goods are being dumped into Malaysia at a price much lower than the price in the domestic market of the alleged countries and that this is causing material injury to the domestic industry in Malaysia. The Petitioner further claimed that imports from the alleged countries have increased in terms of absolute quantity and that the Petitioner suffered material injury.

The Government has determined that there is sufficient evidence of dumping, injury and causal link and therefore decided to initiate a preliminary investigation on such imports. In accordance with the Countervailing and Anti-Dumping Duties Act 1993 and its related Regulations, a preliminary determination is made within 120 days from the date of initiation.
